## NEWS FROM CARDINHAM SCHOOL

### Federation

The governors of Cardinham and Lanivet met to consider the responses to the consultation on federation. In total we received 54 responses; 43 in favour, 6 unsure and 5 against. Governors felt this to be a strong response in favour and unanimously agreed to federate. Further information on the constitution of the governing body will follow.

Those of you who listened to the Chancellor's Autumn statement will recognise there will be large cuts to the LA and will have heard him say state schools run by Local Authorities will be '*a thing of the past*'. This will almost certainly mean further change in response to central government's stated aim of schools becoming academies. Governors feel that as a federation we will be in a much stronger position to ensure we promote and maintain the ethos and unique character that we value so much in our schools.

### CARDINHAM PRE-SCHOOL

St Neot & Cardinham Pre-School have had an exciting 2015 with lots of changes taking place. We increased our numbers for St Neot and the setting now operates for four and a half days a week. We re-opened our Cardinham setting in April and much to our delight from January 2016 we are open for 5 full days a week! Our Pre-School Leader has moved on to pastures new and for 2016 we have asked our Deputy Leader, Sam Donovan, to take the reins and she is doing a fantastic job. A big change for 2016 will be our name. We have decided, with the support of both Schools, to name each setting individually - Cardinham Pre-School and St Neot Pre-School. We are still the same committee and the same staff and we will operate in exactly the same way; children and parents alike will not be affected by the name change. A few days later, store personnel were constructing a huge Swiss log cabin, ready for the arrival of Father Christmas, no doubt.

The preparations for Christmas can become intense, if not overwhelming for some. I too have seen young grandchildren cry at the sight of Father Christmas, as well as run and embrace him. In the Christian Church preparation time for Christmas is four weeks (Advent) and is a moment in the rhythm of the seasons for personal (and corporate) reflection, supported by a sense of excitement, expectation and hope.

Both preparations lead to the same moment and of course bring a sense of wholeness to the celebration. Amidst all the excitement, the rush, the colour, the expense and sometimes worry, or even panic, whatever our age, young or older, we need those moments when we spoil ourselves with a time to be still. Amidst the bustle, that stillness can be with a cup of tea by the fireside as well as in the quietness of the village church (it is open for you to use), or even in silent prayer with others. Moments such as these enrich the Carol singing, the giving and receiving of Christmas cards, the exchange of presents and the aroma of turkey cooking.

This year all of our preparations are set against a backdrop of the events in Paris and of evil in other parts of the world. I have no doubt, that if you take time to be still this Advent you will give thanks for all the gifts you have already received, especially family and friends, and hope that expressions of love and care will eventually overcome hate and bring peace.


