BOILER ROOM SCAMS WHAT ARE THEY AND HOW TO AVOID THEM

- ♦ *What is a Boiler Room?*
Boiler Rooms are businesses that use high-pressure sales techniques to sell "sure thing" investments with the promise of massive returns. In fact, what they're selling is worthless stock in often unquoted companies that are either overvalued, or that simply don't exist at all.
- ♦ *How they work*
Boiler Room operatives generally cold-call their targets, using phone numbers from publicly-available shareholder lists. Because it's against the law for brokers to cold-call in the UK, they tend to be based abroad (often Spain, Switzerland, or the US) where they are beyond the jurisdiction of the Financial Services Authority (FSA). They can approach anyone, anywhere.
- ♦ *Boiler Room techniques*
A Boiler Room can look and sound legitimate. They may mention companies you've heard of, give themselves a UK address or phone number, and possibly even have a professional-looking website. They are notoriously persistent, and can hound a victim for months in the hope of a sale, catching out even seasoned investors. According to the FSA, Boiler Room Scam victims lose on average £20,000. The bottom line is that if an opportunity

sounds too good to be true, then it almost certainly is.

The advice is simple. If you think you're being targeted by a Boiler Room, the FSA's advice is not to worry about being polite - just hang up. You should then call the FSA contact centre on 0845 606 1234 with as much detail as you can remember. You'll find more information about Boiler Rooms on the FSA website www.fsa.gov.uk. If you are receiving unwanted calls from companies, you can register with the Telephone Preference Service (TPS) to stop the contact being made. VEGETABLES :- Potatoes / shallots / carrots / peas / beans / root veg

FRUIT :- Tomatoes / berries / rhubarb

PHOTOGRAPHY :- Tree or trees / fungi, lichen, ferns / colour explosion

COOKERY :- Savoury rolls / Treacle tart / the usual preserves, etc.

Madiera cake (set recipe) -

175g (6oz) Softened butter / 175g (6oz) Caster sugar / 225g (8oz) SR Flour / 50g (2oz) Ground almonds / 3 large eggs / Finely grated rind of 1 lemon / Thin slice of citron peel. 18cm (7in) round cake tin. 180° / Fan 160° / Gas 4—30mins place peel on top and a further 30-45 mins. If you have been watching the "Great British Bake Off" this is your "technical challenge" having been given the list of ingredients, tin size, oven temperature and baking time the rest is up to you!

give praise and thanks to Christ for his sacrifice.

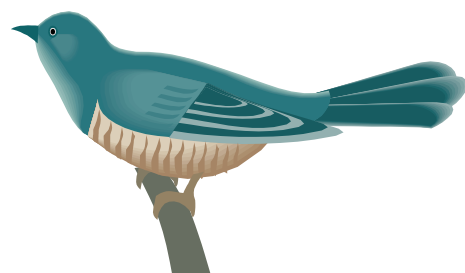
It also has to be remembered that in a few days hence Christ would rise again and give us all hope for our future life. Following the concert a light supper was enjoyed by all.

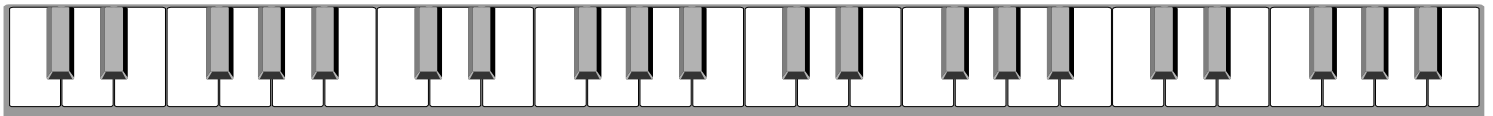

Warleggan Parish Elections: It was agreed that Pat Phillipps would continue as Chairman, and Andy Martin. would continue as Clerk. For the Planning Sub-Committee there were nine candidates for the eight positions. Following a ballot the duly elected **members of the**

HALL HIRE CHARGES—REVISED FEBRUARY 2013**

- ◆ 4 hour session (morning, afternoon or evening):
 - £8 for regular users
 - £12 for casual users
- ◆ Full daytime session for casual users £20
- ◆ Full day to include evening £30
- ◆ Trade and political bookings £30 per session or £50 for a whole day
- ◆ Hall hire for Elections £150 per day
- ◆ A weekend rate is available by negotiation
- ◆ £2 additional charge if kitchen required for teas and coffees (**DOES NOT INCLUDE DISHWASHER**)
- ◆ £5 additional charge for the full use of the kitchen + £20 refundable deposit

A regular user is one that uses the Hall at least once per quarter

China & Cutlery: £25 deposit, with £15 refunded on return, any breakages must be replaced.

Hall Tables: £1 per table, for indoor use only. Hirers are responsible for the collection and return of the tables and replacement or repair of any damage caused. Tables may be taken one day before and returned one day after the event for which hired unless already required in the Hall for a previous booking.

Hall Chairs: 25p per chair. Hirers are responsible for the collection and return of the chairs and replacement or repair of any damage caused. The upholstered chairs are not for hire.

Bingo Equipment: £5 per occasion.
