LETTER FROM THE FALKLANDS

Unfortunately Susie's letter arrived in January just after I had printed off that issue but I thought it would be of interest although we are a few months away now from Christmas. Apart from the isolation, life for the Falkland Islanders is very similar to our life here in Warleggan Parish, except at their "Big Do" there is horse racing and sheep shearing competitions. Now read on :-

Christmas 2013

Christmas in the Falklands falls in the middle of summer so a busy time for farmers in the middle of the shearing season. Many events are organized; on East Falkland there are two days of horse racing in Stanley on 26th & 27th December. On the 29th is a shearing competition which until recently was held on a farm but was moved to Stanley by the organizers to help raise extra funds to send two local shearers and local wool handlers to the Golden Shears competition, which in 2013 was held in New Zealand and in 2014 is to be held in Ireland. They do an amazing job setting up a temporary shearing stand etc in the FIDF (Falkland Island Defense Force) headquarters, which is also used for wedding receptions and dances and various events. On West Falkland there are numerous barbeques, a raft race and a Ram & Fleece Show,

They are all well attended and the Ram & Fleece Show is a big event for farmers, with some spectacular sheep and fleeces on show along with a good social get together with BBQ. You will possibly get to see these events in due course as the Island Parish Team are in the Falklands for several months recording a series for the BBC. It should be aired about October in UK, I think at least six episodes. They have been recording all aspects of life on the Falklands in Stanley and camp. Matthew (my son) should appear somewhere on the program playing with the recorder group.



This summer has been rather atrocious for summer weather, normally during Christmas it is dry, hot and sunny; this year has been cold, wet & windy. Christmas was a bit of a rushed affair at Main Point and very quiet, we had contract shearers here until the eve of the 23rd. Lamb marking taking place over the new year with which is not complete as I write this due to bad

weather but we expect to mark about 800 lambs. Shearers are due back early January, two more lots of sheep to shear. 4,500 run on the farm with an average death rate of 10% over for the Falklands with an average lamb marking percentage of 60%. This is mainly due to the elements, vast areas of land mean shepherding is minimal; lambing is all done outside over vast acres. Soil is poor and pasture is generally quite poor. Early spring and at lambing time, ewes can be in poorer condition if weather is wet and cold lambs often don't get the nourishment they need early on and can die of hypothermia from the elements. Ditches also cause a lot of sheep deaths on the Falklands, there is a ditching program in place and we have recently done some ditching at Main Point. Time will tell how much it improves overall death rates and lambing percentages.

Supplement would be a nice idea but at a cost of over £500 on freight/transport alone for a tonne of feed from UK to our farm here it's not really an option. A tonne of feed wouldn't go far among 1300 breeding ewes.

Shearing is a busy time but is all over very quickly, these boys don't hang around, shearing at least 200 each in an 8 hour day. One local lad sheared 379 big wethers in 8 hours on the largest West Falkland farm this summer.

Breaking the shed record for shearing wethers. Seven shearers (one of which was a woman who sheared 204) sheared a total of 1,789 sheep in an 8 hour day.

Please make the effort – and get your voice heard!


It's very simple to fill in. Just draw a few circles (around activities you might be interested in) and a couple of arrows (for anything you'd be happy to help get started).

Below is an extract from a letter received by Parish Meeting Clerk Andy in October 2013 from The Motor Cycling Club Ltd.



MARCH 2014

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, 5th of March; there will be services of Holy Communion and Ashing at St. Neot Church at 9.00 a.m. and at Cardynham Church at 6.00 p.m. A palm cross from last year's Palm Sunday is burnt by the priest before the service and the resulting ash used to mark those attending with a cross on their foreheads. As he does this, the priest says: "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ". It is a moving ceremony, if you enter into it simply and whole-heartedly. Lent being a time when we may want to think seriously about the gift of life to us and how we are using it. Repentance, thinking again and reflecting honestly on our pattern of living, takes time and effort; it does not come naturally, especially nowadays when so much diversionary entertainment is available at the push of a button. These days you need never sit and think, because there is so much else you can do. In fact, it may be possible to come to the end of your life without ever having really considered what it is all about. What a tragic waste that might be.

Having said that, we may want to avoid what the writer of the First Letter to Timothy in the Bible calls: "a wilderness of words". You can find this in 1. Timothy 1: verse 6. There is no shortage of good advice available to us; so many self-help books on how to live and so much earnest debate about morality. It is easy to lose touch with what we may know already, by being confused and bamboozled. We may even despair of truly knowing anything or believing anything. But for Christians, the danger can be avoided if we but hold to the fundamentals of our faith: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. And on Easter Day, April 20th, we will be able to say: Alleluia! Christ is risen – He is risen indeed, Alleluia!
