RECTOR'S RAMBLINGS - TOWARDS LENT, HOLY WEEK AND EASTER

Soon Lent will be upon us and the mood changes from the celebration of Christmas and Epiphany to reflection, as we prepare for Holy Week and Easter. In some ways a refreshing change.

Lent is traditionally a time when those new to faith spent 40 days in preparation for their baptism and Confirmation at Easter. Today it is a time when we are called to do a bit of spiritual spring cleaning. Lent starts on Ash Wednesday with a Eucharist in St Neot Church at 18.30, and you are invited to be ashed, signed with the cross in ashes, symbolic of belonging to Christ and a sign of leaving behind our mistakes of the past. Whilst on the 18 March there will be a Taizé service for the beginning of Lent at 18.00 in St Neot Church

This year we will run a Lent Group in the vicarage on a Tuesday afternoon. We'll meet at 14.00 and aim to finish at 15.00. These will run on Tuesdays 20 and 27 Feb, 5, 12 and 17 March. We'll use a course based on a program about life and faith used by military chaplains to engage young recruits and nurture some spiritual curiosity. We used the material last year and it is well suited whatever your faith and knowledge of theology. Let me know if you are interested in joining us.

In addition, for those wanting something a little more active there will be some Lent rambles, nothing too heavy, on the Sunday afternoons of 3 and 17 March.

As Lent draws to a close at the end of March, we move into Holy Week and Easter. Compline will be said in Warleggan Church on Wednesday 5th April, Liz will lead a service in Mount Village Hall on Good Friday and again this year we will host the spectacular Easter Vigil on Saturday 8th April at Warleggan Church with the light of the fire, the Vigil, renewal of baptismal vows and the first Eucharist of Easter. Please bring your bells, rattles and pans and wooden spoons, to make a great clatter in celebration of the resurrection

Holy Week is a special time in the church's year, and in fact is the real focus of the Christian faith. Our worship in the Benefice will give us the opportunity to move from celebration to despair and back again to celebration. **Garry Swinton Rector**

NEW INITIATIVES FROM VILLAGE GREENS



NEW! In addition to the organic boxes, we are now offering a vegetable box with a variety of seasonal veg for just £10.00. Items will be locally grown and although not registered organic, are often grown on organic principles. However all items are local with a very low carbon footprint and hardly any plastic packaging. If there are certain items you do *not* want in your box, let us know, we are flexible! Also if you single folk want a smaller box, we can put together a £5 box.

ALSO NEW. We are now offering local doorstep delivery for the village of Mount. Just tell us of a dry place we can leave your veg and groceries and, if you can't collect, it will be left for you around 4.00pm on Thursdays. If you also want dairy and meat delivered please contact us as we need to check that chilled or frozen items are not spoilt, but we can be flexible! At the moment this does just apply to the four roads into Mount as our volunteers can drop boxes off as they leave. We are prepared to extend this if the demand and volunteers are available.

NEW! We are very pleased that we can now offer beef that has been reared only a few hundred yards from Mount. Treveddoe beef, which comes from Belted Gallows reared on organic principles, is delicious and is on our shopping list once every month. We also have a monthly delivery of pasties and sausages, all made just a few miles away using local meat.

NEW! Organic milk in glass bottles is back, but we still have Cornish milk in one or two litres from Rodda's Dairy.

For those of you who are new to the parish, Village Greens is a not-for-profit box scheme run entirely by volunteers for the community. It is now in its 15th year. A shopping list is circulated every week, orders are returned by email and collections/deliveries are Thursdays.

We specialise in providing a choice for people who care about what they eat and care about the environment. We can supply not only local fruit and veg, dairy products and meat, but a range of groceries many of which are organic, or fair trade, are ethically sourced and virtually plastic free. We can also provide environmentally friendly cleaning materials, some of which are available in 5 litre containers to minimise single-use plastic.
